Frequently Asked Questions

What is the project for?

Reverend Garrick Williams has a dream to restore the Park Heights Saints house to a Community center. The 2,000 square foot center will serve as a gathering place for Park Heights Saints Football and Cheerleading teams in between games and throughout the year. This building provides a safe space for the kids who are being mentored and invested in to work, study, and fellowship in protected manner.

Where and when will it be built?

The house is located at 4804 Reisterstown Road, Baltimore, MD 21215. Groundbreaking will begin when there are sufficient funds to start the project.

How much money needs to be raised?

The projected total cost needed to be raised is **\$250,000**. The total cost includes the funds necessary to build the center as well as start-up operating costs.

Why now?

The Park Heights community is very typical of many inner-city neighborhoods. Teen pregnancy, illegal drug activity, HIV, dilapidated houses, and criminal activity are rampant. Kids are faced with the difficult choice to succumb to the seemingly inevitable trajectory that their circumstances provide, or to rise above and reach their potential. Brother Garrick hopes to help kids reach their potential with the installment of the Community center.
